RTK GPS can instantly determine the position of a roving unit to centimeter-level accuracy using carrier phase positioning.</p> <p>Utilizing Virtual Reference Station (VRS), the network of GPS reference stations is established continuously via data links to a control center, creating a living database of Regional Area Corrections. The rover unit, situated nearby would interpret and uses the corrections as if it has come from real reference station.</p> <p>This technique is ideal for various applications such as engineering, cadastral, topographic and detail surveys.</p> <p>MyGEOID, through joint consultancy with the National Land Survey and Cadastre of Denmark (KMS), utilizes datasets from observed DSMM's Terrestrial Gravity Data and Airborne Gravity Data and computed with reference to GGM-1C geopotential model, DEM based on Shuttle Radar Topography Mission and KMS02 satellite altimetry data.</p> <p>The Final Fitted Geoid Model fits local Mean Seal Level of Peninsular Malaysia, Sabah and Sarawak and matches the vertical datum and thus permit users to convert GPS heights in ITRF to leveling heights in the Malaysia Datum.</p> <p>MyGEOID consists of 1' by 1' grid (approx 1.8km) of geoid-ellipsoid separation (N values) that can be interpolated for local use and whose position would be on GDM2000/WGS84 reference coordinates.</p> |              |

eligible parties with ASEAN Member Nations but also to eligible parties from within ASEAN dialogue partners nations.

The Constitution of the Federation would thus need to be amended accordingly.

At the 4<sup>th</sup> Biennial General Meeting –

- all Institutional Members present concurred that like-minded organizations from ASEAN dialogue partners nations be admitted as Corporate Members as proposed;
- certain Institutional Members were of the opinion that restricting the principal offices of the Federation to Institutional Members were too restrictive as there may be capable representatives from within Corporate and Teaching Institution Membership that may be able to provide leadership to the Federation; and
- certain Institutional Members were of the opinion that the President should be elected from amongst members of the out-going council.

Taking into consideration the discussion at the 4<sup>th</sup> Biennial General Meeting, the following proposed amendments are hereby tabled to Council for discussion.

## **2. Present Provision**

Article 6: Membership

1. Membership in the Federation shall be open to persons or organisations in ASEAN countries whose duties and activities respectively are such as to cause them to be interested in the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics.
2. Membership in the Federation shall be of five categories: Institutional, Corporate Honorary, Sustaining and Teaching Institution.

The requirements for admission shall be:

3. a) Institutional Membership:

A legally constituted national professional institution, association, organisation or other similar body whose activities include the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics or are concerned with the same.

b) Corporate Membership:

A firm or corporate body whose activities include the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics or are concerned with the same.

c) Honorary Membership:

A person of outstanding eminence and long experience in the science and practice of some phase of land surveying and geomatics and has contributed outstanding services to the Federation may be elected to Honorary Membership by the recommendation of the Council and the approval by members carrying a simple majority vote by ballot.

d) Sustaining Membership:

A person or firm or company who/which is keenly interested in the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics but is not eligible for election to other classes of membership.

e) Teaching Institution Membership:

This class of membership is reserved for institutions or establishments of high learning which conduct courses in the fields of land surveying and geomatics. These include such bodies as Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (Malaysia), Universiti Teknologi MARA (Malaysia) and Institut Teknologi Bandung (Indonesia), etc.

The rights and privileges of members are as follows: -

a) Each Institutional Member shall be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to membership vote.

b) The vote of an Institutional Member shall be exercised through its authorised representative.

c) Election to the Offices of the Federation shall be the privilege of the Institutional Members, Corporate Members and Teaching Institution Members, provided that the composition of both Corporate members and Teaching Institutional members

4. shall be four (4).

d) Honorary and Sustaining members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of members in the Federation except the right to vote and hold office in the Federation.

5. All applications for membership of the Federation except for membership under Clause 3(b) above, shall be sponsored by two members and shall be submitted on the prescribed membership application form as approved by the Council from time to time containing all the details required thereon in full to the Honorary Secretary-General who shall cause them to be placed before the Council for consideration.

6. Every applicant whose application has been approved as aforesaid shall, upon payment of the prescribed entrance fee and annual subscription, be admitted as a member of the Federation and shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership.

### **3. Proposed Amendment**

*Article 6: Membership*

1. *a) Membership in the Federation shall be open to persons or organisations in ASEAN countries whose duties and activities respectively are such as to cause them to be interested in the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics;*

*b) Membership in the Federation shall be of five categories: Institutional, Corporate, Honorary, Sustaining and Teaching Institution.*

2. Corporate Membership in the Federation shall also be open to organizations from within ASEAN Dialogue Partner countries whose duties and activities respectively are such as to cause them to be interested in the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics.

*The requirements for admission shall be:*

a) *Institutional Membership:*

*A legally constituted national professional institution, association, organisation or other similar body whose activities include the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics or are concerned with the same.*

3. b) *Corporate Membership:*

i] A firm or corporate body whose activities include the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics or are concerned with the same; or

ii] A legally constituted professional institution or association or similar body from an ASEAN Dialogue Partner countries whose activities include the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics or are concerned with the same.

c) *Honorary Membership:*

*A person of outstanding eminence and long experience in the science and practice of some phase of land surveying and geomatics and has contributed outstanding services to the Federation may be elected to Honorary Membership by the recommendation of the Council and the approval by members carrying a simple majority vote by ballot.*

d) *Sustaining Membership:*

*A person or firm or company who/which is keenly interested in the science and practice of land surveying and geomatics but is not eligible for election to other classes of membership.*

e) *Teaching Institution Membership:*

*This class of membership is reserved for institutions or*

*establishments of high learning which conduct courses in the fields of land surveying and geomatics. These include such bodies as Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (Malaysia), Universiti Teknologi MARA (Malaysia) and Institut Teknologi Bandung (Indonesia), etc.*

*4. The rights and privileges of members are as follows: -*

*a) Each Institutional Member shall be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to membership vote.*

*b) The vote of an Institutional Member shall be exercised through its authorised representative.*

*c) Election to the Offices of the Federation shall be the privilege of the Institutional Members, Corporate Members and Teaching Institution Members, provided that -(i) the composition of both Corporate members and Teaching Institutional members shall be not exceed four (4); and*

*(ii) the President shall be elected from amongst members of the outgoing Council.*

*d) Honorary and Sustaining members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of members in the Federation except the right to vote and hold office in the Federation.*

*5. All applications for membership of the Federation ~~except for membership under Clause 3(b) above,~~ shall be sponsored by two members and shall be submitted on the prescribed membership application form as approved by the Council from time to time containing all the details required thereon in full to the Honorary Secretary-General who shall cause them to be placed before the Council for consideration.*

*6. Every applicant whose application has been approved as aforesaid shall, upon payment of the prescribed entrance fee and annual subscription, be admitted as a member of the Federation and shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership.*
