Distinguished Councillors, members, ladies and gentlemen,

As you notice, this is the 28th Council Meeting of AFLAG. As I have expressed my anxieties in the past few meetings, what have we resolved to do? What have we achieved? I wish to recall and quote Professor Holger Magel, Past President of FIG, in his keynote speech at the Opening of the 8th SEAS Congress in Bandar Seri Begawan, Brunei Darussalam 2 years ago:

"One decisive attitude to reach our commitment and roles is to remove 'silo' thinking and acting of disciplines and governmental institutions. Instead of 'silos' we need interdisciplinary approaches especially by building and using geo-referenced data base infrastructures thus achieving more comprehensive and sustainable impact, i.e. well-balanced solutions. The reason for it is very simple and a way of best convincing politicians and decision makers. About 80 % of daily decisions on national or local level, either in economy, finances/taxation, demography, spatial planning, environment, hazard areas, security, infrastructure, housing, cultural heritage, sustain geographical names, etc. is spatially or - like we say - geo-referenced!

That demonstrates clearly, surveying is a central pillar of each country and its economy!

Prof Holger Magel is deeply convinced that we still have not reached the utmost of all possibilities of especially GIS and SDI technologies managed by surveyors in order to serve society and SD. To use all possibilities surveyors should not be excellent technicians, producers and managers of data only but also excellent 'Managers of

	<p>Property, Land, Marine and Construction’ according to the motto ‘From Surveying to Serve Society’. The famous Spanish writer Ortega y Gasset once said: “To be a good technician it is not enough to be a good technician only.” What does this mean in this context? Surveyors should play a visible role in society, and then should try to become actively and additionally involved in fields of spatial planning, urban and rural development, valuation, real estate management and decision making! In fields which are traditionally not regarded as surveyors’ domains!</p> <p>Holger knows that this is not easy to reach. It is a question of attitude and mindset again but it should be attempted – one reason is thus to better understand the needs of society and institutions, e.g. for spatially enabled LIS! My experience is more or less disappointing: If GIS people do not get involved enough in local policy or spatial planning and land management etc., a lot of their work remains a nice theory or model without much practical use! ”</p> <p>end quote</p> <p>The 9th SEAS Congress in Christchurch New Zealand is only 4 months away. The SEAS Congress is our flagship event. Herewith, I am appealing to all members to support the Congress. I am happy to note that there is already a considerable contribution in terms of technical papers. I am equally grateful Mr Teo Chee Hai who has been liaising very closely with our New Zealand colleagues. Mr Teo would be highlighting this event later in the Agenda.</p> <p>I am convinced, the SEAS Congress provides a platform for learning as well as knowledge and technology transfer. Hopefully, upon returning from the Congress, we could further demonstrate our resolve to be a central ‘pillar’ in national development. Hence, the role of the surveyors and geomaticians should be more visible.</p> <p>Nearer to shore, we have to address the sustainability of our precious organization. There we get a small balance amounting RM5726.90.</p> <p>On page 3 Balance Sheet, Total Assets RM127,147.00 which we have bad account due from members RM40,500.00. Our Liabilities is RM16,635.00 which will be paid up as soon as we can. 8.2	<p>SINGAPORE</p> <p>Mr Tan Choo Haw reported:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Land Surveyors Board, Singapore has approved the third review of the Land Surveyors Board Directives on Engineering and Hydrographic Survey Practices. The latest review incorporates Gazette Notification survey, RTK and Deformation Survey. The Directives are posted on Land Surveyors Board Website. 2) A new Land Surveyors Board was appointed with effect from 1 June 2007 for a period of two years. 3) The new Singapore Institute Surveyors and Valuers Land Survey Divisional Council were elected on 1 April 2007. 3 members of the Council were also appointed to the new Land Surveyors Board. 4) Singapore Land Authority has initiated a 5 year plan on Singapore's Surveying & Mapping Infrastructure Strategy. It is currently reviewing feedbacks from the public and stakeholders. 5) Singapore Land Authority is also reviewing the Classifications of Errors in Cadastral Survey and the Directives on Cadastral Survey. 	<p>Institute Surveyors and Valuers is being consulted on the proposed changes.</p> <p>6) Land Surveyors (Amendment) Act 2007 became operational on 2 May 2007. It made related and consequential amendments to Boundaries and survey Maps Act and Land Surveyors Rules. The main amendments (a) deletes the condition of a Registered Surveyor who has not renewed his practicing certificate for a period of 10 years from being removed from the register of surveyors. This is no longer relevant as a Registered Surveyor must obtain requisite Continuing Professional Development units before his practicing certificate can be renewed each year. (b) Provides for the licensing of Limited Liability Partnership for Registered Surveyor to supply survey services. This is another corporate structure for Registered Surveyor to practice. An example is that an investor to the Limited Liability Partnership carries no liability of the practice. The Registered Surveyor of the Limited Liability Partnership will continue to bear the responsibility and the liability. (c) Requires a candidate who passed the board's examinations to pass a professional interview conducted by the board before he can be registered. This is to determine if the candidate has aptitude and knowledge to enable him to perform survey work effectively.</p> <p>President thanked Mr Tan Choo Haw for his report.</p>	
<p>8.3</p>	<p>VIETNAM</p> <p>Prof Le Quy Thuc reported ;</p> <p>Since the early years of the last decade, GIS-technology, the subsequent result of the integration of information technology in geography sciences, has found its application in various institutions and agencies, in different activities fields like surveying and mapping, land administration, natural resources investigation and management, environment study and preservation, infrastructure construction, defense, etc... Results acquired during the first implementation years are promising. It consists in facilitating data collection, processing, retrieval and information display, both in soft- and hard-copy, but years after, problems arise, one after another.</p> <p>Many institutions and agencies in our country engaged in GIS activities without coordination. It can often be found that many different agencies collected the same data at the same or different time. In many cases this duplication of efforts, time and money is due to the fact that this organization can't be aware or can't make use of data collected by others.</p> <p>GIS users and developers used to built their own datasets, in their own manner, procedure and standards. As a result the sharing of these datasets between organizations is difficult, due to many incompatibilities between the datasets. This, in one hand hinders the best utilization</p>	<p>Info.</p>

	<p>of the data acquired, in the other hand, inhibits the timely upgrading of the system. to keep the GIS regularly up-dated and upgraded, an enormous quantity of diverse data has to be collected, processed, and analyzed. Under deficiency of collaboration and agreement between GIS developers, it is difficult to an organization alone to be able to realize further development in GIS implementation. Thus, single-handed GIS-users and providers are pushed into dilemma.
